Dayville, Killingly Central School COMPARE - IT PROGRAM

Compare-it is a professional development process developed at Killingly Central School, a United States Blue Ribbon Elementary School, in Dayville. The acronym describes the on-line and fact-to-face process of Collaborating, Modeling, PrActicing, and Reflecting with Integrated Technology. The Technology Coordinator, Verna Sodano-Richards, collaborates, models and reflects with teachers on-line while residing in Atlanta, Georgia. One week a month, in Killingly, she supports the on-line dimension of the process by collaborating, modeling and reflecting with a staff of approximately 30 classroom teachers. Teachers learn and practice with their students in a creative climate. Learning is real. Teachers have measurably increased their technology proficiencies based on the Connecticut Technology Proficiencies and are integrating technology into the elementary curriculum by using the COMPARE-IT program. Next year, the program will be integrated into the professional development program of all 250 teachers in Killingly. (The Connecticut Association of Schools 2000, p.9)
